School life expectancy represents the expected number of years of schooling that will be completed, including years spent repeating one or more grades. It is a synthetic summary indicator of the overall pettern of enrolment ratios at one particular point in time, and has no predictive value except in so far as it is believed that enrolment patterns remain unchanged into the future.

AUFAD believes that the school life expectancy (SLE), will be inflating logical reasoning and reality. Knowing that over 70 % of the continents population live in the suburb and rural areas. Compounded by war, poverty and hunger, that in-turn creates child soldiers, child traders (because parents have been overtaken by Aids) and Juvenil deliquency due to rural-urban migration and dissipating moral values.

We therefore hold the view that not more than 50 % of the targeted age group in the survey will succeed in meeting the school life expextency (SLE).
